We reserve the right to cancel the show if there are insufficient entries or the venue is no longer available for use.

The Vancouver Island Chapter of BC Carriage Driving Society is the host of the Horse Crazy Adventures Field Trials and Combined Test.

The FDT will consist of dressage, cones, and marathon with three obstacles in an enclosed area.

The Field Trails are approved by BCCDS and sanctioned by Horse Council of BC.

The CT (Combined Dressage and Cones) are approved by BCCDS and sanctioned by Horse Council of BC. Both the Field Trials and CT's are qualifiers for the Horse Council Championships (Training and Prelim levels only). They will be governed in accordance with the HCBC Rule Book 2025. Knowledge of the rules is the responsibility of the competitor.

Competition Management has the right to combine levels and/or divisions to accommodate entries if required. The Field Trail levels offered at this competition.

- a) Training Beginner Level suitable for beginner drivers or equines with less than 2 years driving experience
- b) Training Open Level -Suitable for drivers or professionals with more than 2 years experience and allows experienced drivers to compete at training level
- c) Preliminary Beginner Level Suitable for competitors with more than two years driving experience. This level allows competitors to move up from Training Open and compete with other drivers at the same skill
- d) Preliminary Open Level Suitable for drivers or equines with more than two years driving experience at a higher level of competition and allows experienced/higher level drivers to compete with other drivers at the same skill level.

**The CT** will consist of dressage and cones only.

Levels Offered are- Beginner and Open Training, Training and Open Preliminary and Intermediate levels will be offered.

Competition Management reserves the right to combine levels if lack of entries warrants it.

## (Training)ADS Test B, Level 2 (Preliminary) ADS Test B, and Intermediate level B ADS test will be used.

\*Turnout: Single, Pair, Tandem.

\*Divisions: Horse, Pony, VSE

\*Prizes will be awarded in levels and age of drivers (First, Second and Third) Daily Highpoint and Reserve Highpoint awarded for the Field Trials.

It is the responsibility of the show/event committee, or competition organizers and the facility owners and managers to ensure that all BC Health Authority and WorkSafeBC directives are followed and enforced. Horse Council is not a regulatory body, and it is understood and agreed that sanctioning and approval of a HCBC Provincial competition /event relates to the use of the rule book and approved officials only.

This Competition is a Horse Council BC provincially sanctioned competition and will be governed in accordance with the Horse Council BC Rule Book. Knowledge of the rules is the responsibility of Competition Management, Officials and Competitors. The Horse Council BC Rule Book, can be found at www.hcbc.ca https://hcbc.ca/competitions/competition-documents/
Neither Horse Council BC, its Board of Directors, organizing committee, staff, volunteers, officials, or employees of the horse show, will be responsible in any way, for damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses or property of exhibitors, spectators, owners, riders, trainers, or grooms. All competitors and owners of horses must be members of Horse Council BC to participate."
Neither Vancouver Island Chapter of BCCDS, its board of directors, organizing committee, volunteers, officials or land owners will be responsible in any way, for damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses, or property of exhibitors, spectators, owners, drivers, trainers or grooms. All competitors must be current members of Horse Council of BC to participate at the Horse Crazy Adventures Driving Trials and Combined Test. Proof of membership must be sent with registration form.

#### **General Rules:**

Competition numbers assigned must be worn by the driver or be attached and visible on the carriage in the warm up area, in and around the exhibition grounds and during the competition. All competitors must wear properly fitted approved BSI or ASTM protective headgear with safety harness correctly secured at all times while driving on the exhibition grounds in the warm up area and during the competition. Under penalty of elimination, only the competing exhibitor may drive horses competing at the Horse Crazy Adventures Field Driving Trials and Combined Test from the time the horse arrives at the competition grounds to the end of the competition. Viewing the course is open Friday afternoon 3pm until 7.pm.

Unauthorized assistance of any kind during the Trials which includes any coaching, any signals or discussion given to the competitor by any individual who is not an Official, may result in elimination at the sole discretion of the Judges. Unauthorized passengers on the carriages are not permitted.

A hard copy of the HCBC Rule Book will be available to any competitor in the show office during the competition. The HCBC Rule Book is available for download online at: Horse Council of BC home page/competitions/competition documents. Or can be downloaded from the BCCDS Facebook page. The ADS dressage tests are available for download

Drivers will have a presentation/spares kit/safety check prior to each dressage test.

- Dry camping no hookup, must bring your own temporary stalls
- Dogs must be kept on a leash and contained in the camping/trailer area whilst the competition is in progress. Clean up after your dog.
- Presentation will be scored in Dressage
- The cones course is Trot only at Training level. Prelim and Intermediate level may trot or canter in the cones course, however organizers may restrict cantering at the discretion of the organizers due to safety concerns.
- The number of sets of cones/obstacles to a maximum of 20, will be determined at the discretion of competition management and will be based on available space and the capacity of the course to flow well
- Cantering is permitted only to make it up a hill for VSE on the marathon: at the summit must come directly back to trot or penalties will occur.
- Worn protective vests are mandatory on the marathon
- Drivers will have a presentation/spares kit check/safety check prior to each dressage test
- All turn outs must have a Spares Kit on the carriage
- 40x 80 dressage ring for all turn outs

### 2.8 (g) Vehicles

- 1. All vehicles must be safe and in good working condition.
- 2. Two or four wheeled vehicles are permitted
- 3. At Training Level pneumatic tires with wire spoked wheels are permitted
- 4. Bicycle style pneumatic tires are only permitted at training and preliminary levels and not permitted when cantering.
- 5. Pneumatic tires made specifically for the use of a carriage are permitted at any level.
- 6. At Preliminary Level pneumatic tires with solid spoked wheels are permitted
- 7. Sulky or stirrup type racing carts will not be allowed.
- 9. All vehicles must have a solid or mesh floor

#### 2.8 (a) Attire

- 2.For Training Level Marathon attire may be worn at all times in Field Trail However, if competing in the CT traditional attire needs to be used
- 3. Prelim level uses Traditional attire in Dressage and Cones and Marathon attire on the marathon
- 4. Marathon attire consists of ankle length and durable pants, boots, gloves, a polo shirt, Tee shirt or fitted long sleeve shirt. Helmets are required.
- 5. Protective vests are Mandatory for the marathon
- 6. Inflatable vests are not considered safe for driving
- 7.Long hair should be worn neatly in a braid, bun or fully under the helmet. The use of a hair net is recommended.
- 8. Hoof boots are allowed on Marathon only

### Formal Dressage Attire is required if you are entering the Combined Test (CT).

Before their test, competitors should drive near to the Judge's booth and state their competitor number, level (training, preliminary, etc.).

Competitors must enter the dressage court within the time stated in the rulebook

### **Formal Dressage Attire:**

Attire – as this is classed as a Pleasure Driving class formal attire is required i.e.,

Gentlemen – jacket, collar, tie. Apron or lap robe, brown gloves, helmet.

Ladies – dress, skirt, pant suit, pants, jacket, or long-sleeved blouse. Apron or lap robe, brown gloves, helmet.

Drivers can enter the FTs and/or the CTs. Drivers will only complete one dressage test and cones course per day. Placings to third place in the Training, Prelim, and Intermediate levels.

## **Entry Fees:**

- FDT: BCCDS Members \$80 per day, Juniors \$60 per day, Non- BCCDS Members \$100 per day, Juniors \$ 70 per day,
- Entry Fees for CT. This is a separate event. CT-BCCDS Members \$40 a day CT-Non-BCCDS Members \$60 a day Juniors, (members or non members) pay \$20 a day
- If entering both FT and CT, BCCDS member pays an additional \$20 per day or \$35 for two days. Juniors pay \$15 per day or \$25 for 2 days Non BCCDS Members pay an additional \$20 per day

Please note: Anyone handling your horse or any horse needs to fill out and hand in the liability form. There is a separate one for <u>Under the Age of Majority and another for over the age of Majority.</u>
